Children's entries to be their own work, under supervision and include their age.

Please check all other class requirements shown, including the use of labels, jars and bottles.

All food entries must be covered.

1st, 2nd & 3rd prize cards will be awarded for each class (1-24)

Entrants are invited to donate generously for their show entries.

A minimum donation of 50p per entry applies to the adult classes.

There is no minimum entry donation for the children's classes.

Thank you in advance to those leaving exhibits for sale as fund raising.

All entries must be made on the official form, enclosed.

- 10 Vase of mixed flowers

(6 inch maximum height)

Cookery

- 12 Any cake
(single large cake, served on a plate)
13 6 Biscuits or small cakes
(served on a plate)
14 One bottle of drink
(label stating content, alcoholic or non-alcoholic)
15 Jar of jam
(1lb approximately)
16 Jar of chutney
(1lb approximately)

- 17 One handmade item of craft

19 Caption of photograph overleaf
